



## HISTORICAL GLIMPSES

- 1904 - QC was conceived to absorb the spillover of urban growth in Manila;
- 1939 - National Assembly enacted Quezon City known as Commonwealth Act No. 502. Quezon City was officially created October 12, 1939;
- 1942 - Executive Order No. 400 - created the city Greater Manila which included the City of Manila, Quezon City, Caloocan, San Juan, Makati, Mandaluyong, Pasay and Parañaque;
- 1945 - Republic Act No. 54 - repealed Executive Order No. 400 dated January 2, 1942 and EO No. 58 dated July 26, 1945;
- 1946 - National Planning Commission took over the execution of the master plan of QC;
- 1947 - Republic Act No. 45 - Quezon City remained as part of Greater Manila until January 2, 1947 when its separate political existence was restored;
- July 1947 - Construction of Old City Hall in EDSA at the cost of P125,130.00;
- 1948 - Quezon City became the official capital of the nation when then President Elpidio Quirino signed Republic Act No. 353 on July 17, 1948; President Quirino created the Capital City Planning Commission which would prepare the general development plan for the proper zoning and subdivision of the capital of the Philippines;
- 1949 - Republic Act No. 392 changed the boundary of the city and declared its area to be 15,359 hectares, thus making Quezon City as one of the largest cities in the world in point of area on June 18, 1949;
- 1949 - Construction of the Roxas housing project consisting of 1,014 housing units, with an area of 39.5 hectares;
- 1950 - Republic Act No. 537 shall be known as the Revised Charter of Quezon City;
- 1951 - Construction of Quirino Project 2 with 1,103 family units on land with an area of 38 hectares;
- 1953 - Construction of Quirino Project 3 consisting of 1,226 family units with an area of 38 hectares;
- June 6 1952 - RA No. 727 - Barrio Talipapa was renamed Tandang Sora in honor of the "Mother of Balintawak";
- 1954 - Construction of Quirino Project 4 consisting of 3,039 family units with a land area of 92.5 hectares;
- 1959 - Republic Act No. 2259 - the highest official of Quezon City became elective;
- 1976 - Presidential Decree No. 940 - deprived Quezon City to its distinction as the capital of the Philippines and the distinction was returned to the City of Manila.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS THAT HAPPENED IN Q.C.

- 1896 - August 23 Bonifacio and his men tore their cedula at Pugad Lawin, which started the Filipino revolution against Spain;
- 1897 - The Pact of Biak-na-Bato - the first two documents were signed on December 14, 1897 and the third on December 15, 1897 at Biak-na-Bato;
- 1972 - 1971 Constitutional Convention was drafted in Quezon City Hall;
- 1986 - February revolution at EDSA.

## QUEZON CITY PLACES OF INTEREST AND LANDMARKS

**QUEZON CITY HALL** : a 14-storey edifice, built during the term of ex-Mayor Norberto S. Amoranto. It was designed by Ruperto Gaite; constructed by the Weldon Construction under the supervision of the QC Engineer's Office in 1964 under Resolution No. 6670; and inaugurated on Jan. 1, 1972. It acquired historical significance when the 1971 Constitutional Convention, transferred its venue on August 3, 1972 from the Manila Hotel to the top three floors of the QC Hall. Beautifully landscaped premises featuring a Sunken Garden, a man-made lagoon, and an orchids garden.

**WELCOME ROTONDA** : the now familiar "Welcome" gateway to Quezon City from Manila was designed in 1948 by City Architect Luciano V. Aquino in the office of then Mayor Ponciano Bernardo. The small lions at its base were donated by the Lions of Quezon City.

**ARANETA COLISEUM** : the biggest domed Coliseum in the world with a seating capacity of 25,000. Scene of many international sports events like Ali-Frazier title fight in October, 1975. Utilized as venue for the Holiday on Ice and Miss Asia Quest.

**PHILIPPINE HEART CENTER FOR ASIA** : it has the latest facilities, equipment, techniques in the care and treatment of heart ailments. Heart specialists from all over the world meet here periodically for exchange and sharing of cardiovascular knowledge.

**QUEZON MEMORIAL CIRCLE** : a 26-hectare park which promises to rival the Luneta Park when fully developed under a P15 million five year development program. At present, the circle is dominated by the towering tri-pillared Quezon Monument and museum

in whose underground chambers are housed the Quezon City Museum and Art Gallery. Within the circle is the world's biggest colored fountain. On November 29, 1971 Pope VI celebrated a papal mass inside the circle attended by more than a million people.

LA MESA DAM : source of water supply for the Metro Manila area. Wooded areas around the dam makes it a paradise for picnickers and campers.

U.P. BALARA PARK : chief attractions are swimming resort, filters to purify the water coming from La Mesa Dam, windmill, miniature of a Spanish castle and fountains.

SAN PEDRO DE BAUTISTA CHURCH : also known as the Church of San Francisco del Monte, since it is located there, this church is the second oldest church in the Philippines. Its 16th century parish priest, Father Pedro de Bautista, has been canonized, and the church now bears his name. His bones are buried in the church, and parts of the old altar still exists.

BATASANG PAMBANSA BUILDING : housing the national parliament, this building stands on a picturesque site, with a breath-taking backdrop of mountains and valleys. It is an impressive building, built along modern lines, with spacious hallways and foyers.

SANTO DOMINGO CHURCH : this is one of the biggest churches in the Philippines. It is the shrine of the celebrated Our Lady of the Holy Rosary, the patroness of Quezon City, and its feast in October 11 is one of the country's most beautiful festivals.

UNIVERSITY OF THE PHILIPPINES : this state university has one of the world's largest campuses. In educational standards, it is one of Asia's leading institutions. Students from all over

the world are enrolled in U.P. and alumni of the school have become leaders in over a hundred countries.

QUEZON INSTITUTE : situated along E. Rodriguez Avenue, in Barrio Santol, Quezon City. It was named after President Quezon who was, himself, a victim of tuberculosis.

CLOVERLEAF : gateway to Metro Manila from the North, the cloverleaf, or the Balintawak Transmission Complex, becomes historical when one realizes that it is the site where the "First Cry of Balintawak" was uttered on August 24, 1896. The celebrated Bonifacio monument, which had been at the U.P. Campus, now stands in its proper place at one side of the Cloverleaf.

IGLESIA NI KRISTO : a magnificent edifice that looks like a palace transported from medieval times.

ATOMIC REACTOR : shaped like the half of an egg. This structure the only one of its kind in the country signifies the country's involvement in the atomic age.

NINOY AQUINO PARK (FORMER PARK & WILDLIFE) : An 80 hectare complex of wooded areas for picnicking or leisurely rambling place. There is a children's playground and a man-made lagoon for boating. Specimen of the country's fauna and flora, including the monkey-eating eagle, can be seen here.

BARRIO PUGAD LAWIN : a place where, on August 23, 1896, Andres Bonifacio, founder of the Katipunan, tore his cedula as a dauntless expression of his clear defiance of the Spanish government in the Philippines. The act signalled the open uprising of the Filipinos against the Spaniards.

LA LOMA COCKPIT : located at Retiro St., La Loma, Quezon City.

HIMLAYANG PILIPINO : located at Tandang Sora, Q.C. it is also here where Si Malakas and Maganda was built.

CAMP CRAME AND CAMP AGUINALDO : these are two of the Philippines' most important military headquarters. Facing each other on E. delos Santos Avenue, they are important historical sites, not only for Quezon City, but for the entire Philippines. In these two camps were born most of the significant military strategies of the country. Both have fascinating museums showing their respective roles in Philippine history.

RADIO VERITAS : this is the only radio station in the Philippines whose broadcasts are heard practically all over the world, because of its powerful transmitters. Visited by both Pope Paul VI and Pope John Paul II, this is the radio station through which their messages were beamed to Asia and the world. It is run by the Catholic hierarchy in the Philippines, and it stands on a sprawling lot in the Fairview Park area, not far from the parliament building.

OUTSTANDING ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF EACH MAYOR

TOMAS B. MORATO - NOVEMBER 5, 1942 (First Mayor of QC)

Despite very limited funds, he was able to construct a network of roads in accordance with the first master plan, and despite an inadequate police force of only 48, he was able to contain criminality on the belief that vice is the father of the crime; cockpits, cabarets and other social evils in the new city.

PONCIANO A. BERNARDO - JAN. 1, 1947 - APRIL 28, 1949

Worked like one obsessed to fulfill the dream of his friend, M.L. Quezon. He often made ocular inspection tours of QC, at times using a bicycle. It was during his term that RA 333 making Quezon City "The National Capital of the Philippines" and the permanent seat of the "National Government" which was approved by Pres. Quirino.

Among his pet projects were the construction of the first QC Hall building, Bernardo Park, and the establishment of public libraries, the 1st one is the QC Public Library which was inaugurated on August 16, 1948.

NICANOR A. ROXAS - MAY 4, 1949 - JAN. 6, 1950

Had the shortest term of 8 months. It was significant because Quezon City became the true National focus of development. It was inaugurated as the National Capital of the Philippines on October 22, 1949. The cornerstone of the capital building was laid on the Constitutional Hill.

IGNACIO SANTOS DIAZ - JAN. 6, 1950 - DEC. 30, 1953

He was known as "The builder". Twenty nine public buildings were constructed during his term and

public services like education and health improved tremendously. The new law increased the area of Quezon City to 15,359 hectares, the number of councilors from eight (8).

NORBERTO S. AMORANTO - JAN. 1, 1954 -  
MARCH 31, 1976

Served the longest term as QC Mayor. He had among his notable accomplishments, the codification for the first time of all city ordinances on taxes and revenues; public works construction such as school buildings, health centers, public markets, parks and playgrounds, libraries, building of roads and bridges and the construction of the 14-storey City Hall.

Mayor Amoranto was a man who had a compassionate heart for the poor, he opened the City Hall to the common tao. He believed that "A triumph of peace and love is more fulfilling than any infrastructure".

ADELINA S. RODRIGUEZ - APRIL 1, 1976 - APRIL 13, 1986

First lady Mayor; she is often cited for her barangay and social welfare projects, among her vital achievements are: comprehensive development program on manpower development, infrastructure, slum improvement, barangay, educational, health improvement, cleanliness and beautification, industrial, commercial and government organizational development. "Palagiang Paglingap sa mga Mamamayan" program; founded the wal-in-skills training center of the Q.C. Council of Women to involve more women in civic projects. Implementation of the KKK program wherein the poorest of the poor were able to start a livelihood within the concept of the program and the establishment of the QC Kabuhayan Technological center. Installation of public faucets, artesian wells and deep wells particularly in depressed areas

and places not covered by MWSS; construction of the QC Public Library main building; complete reconstruction of the Roxas District Library, establishment of branch libraries in barangays Del Monte and Masagana; also the restoration & development of the QC Museum in coordination with the NHI & the QCPL housed at the QC Memorial Shrine.

BRIGIDO R. SIMON, JR. - APRIL 20, 1986 to the present

- Established the People's Welfare Council - a sort of mini city Halls in 19 areas in QC to attend to local needs and problems;
- On Squatter Problem :  
Awarded titles to squatter beneficiaries. Some 6,000 families have received titles in barangays Pansol, Sitio Maligaya, Capri, Bagong Silangan, Manresa, Bagumbayan and Masambong; expropriation of private lands with the assistance of the QC Foundation Inc. for the squatters who will pay for their lots for 25 years; relocation of squatters along the creeks, rivers or sidewalks to Barangay Bagong Silang in Caloocan City;
- On Sidewalk Vendors :  
Provided facilities for the traders such as mobile cart or folding canvas-covered sites at designated places, which are leased to the vendors at P5.00 a day thus creating income for the city. Some 1,000 stalls have been built so far in such vending sites at Tandang Sora, Qubao, the Philcoa Center, Cloverleaf, Quezon Avenue, and along EDSA;
- On Health and Sanitation Aspects :  
Purchased more medicines for indigent

patients, improved hospital facilities and through the social workers have conducted nutrition and sanitation seminars in depressed areas. Mobilized health centers to give immunizations during epidemics;

--- On Law and Order :

The crime rate has declined by 25% as a result of buying 31 police vehicles, hiring 600 police auxiliaries, 640 barangay security men and 100 traffic aides, and created 2 new sub-stations complete with communications equipment;

--- On Education Area :

Completed the construction of 32 classrooms accommodating 3,200 students at a cost of P61 million, with 138 new classrooms targetted for completion by the end of this year;

--- On Garbage Collection :

75% increased in efficiency with the acquisition of new garbage trucks, and the employment and deployment of 200 push carts "kareton" further increased efficiency by 5%;

--- On Beautification Program :

Beautifying and improving the Morato Ave. as a socio-civic center; and also the Ninoy Aquino Park (Park and Wildlife);

--- Livelihood Program :

"Suklay at Gunting" and the "Kuhol" production; a project designed to develop small entrepreneurs among QC residents;

Spiritual Upliftment :

For the spiritual upliftment of the employees, there is an on-going Catholic Life in the Spirit Seminar (CLSS) wherein the spirituality of the individual is developed and strengthened.

OTHER PROJECTS :

1. Housing allocation for teachers & police force at the Condominium Housing Project, Balumbato, Quezon City;
2. Creation of QC Consultative Council by virtue of Executive Order No. 14 to bring closer ties between the Mayor & the employees;
3. Expansion of City Jail, and for the inmates to provide opportunities for livelihood and spiritual enhancement to prepare them for acceptance back to their families & society;
4. Rehabilitation & expansion of Bagbag Cemetery & Baesa Cemetery;
5. Dredging & improvement of basement along Balumbato Creek Barangay Unang Sitaw;
6. Housing project for the Q.C. employees;
7. Barring of Lewd Shows;
8. Organizing the barangay intelligence network, to provide information for whatever illegal activities are going on in their respective barangays.





QUEZON CITY PUBLIC LIBRARY - A BRIEF HISTORY

The Quezon City Public Library started as a small unit, a joint venture of the National Library and the Q.C. government during the incumbency of the late Mayor Ponciano Bernardo and the first City Superintendent of Libraries, Atty. Felicidad A. Peralta assisted by Ms. Julia B. Velasquez.

Side by side with the physical and economical development of Q.C., the officials particularly the late Mayor Bernardo envisioned the needs of the people. Realizing that the achievement of the goals of a democratic society depends greatly on enlightened and educated citizenry, the QC Public Library was organized and was inaugurated on August 16, 1948. It started with 4,000 volumes donated by the National Library, with four employees to serve the public. The library was housed next to the post office in a one-storey building at the rear of the old City Hall in EDSA. Even at the start, this unit depended on the civic spirited members of the community who donated books, shelves and other reading materials.

As the city grew, the library services have to be expanded in order to cope with the needs of the increasing library patrons. The City Librarian requested for the opening of more branches, so in 1953 under Mayor Ignacio Santos Diaz the Project 3 branch was established.

Upon the assumption to office of Mayor Norberto S. Amoranto, the development and progress of the QC Public Library was hastened because of numerous requests from the people. Mayor Amoranto approved the establishment of eight branch libraries scattered in the different districts of QC.

In 1957, the main office moved to a spacious place at the second floor of the old City Hall.

The city council approved Ordinance No. 3550, an ordinance prescribing the powers and duties of the City Librarian, promulgating the rules and regulations.

From the old City Hall, the Main Library moved to the Lion's Int'l building in Bernardo Park in 1968. The space was donated by the incumbent Lions Officials to the city government.

In 1969, the Law Research Center was organized to answer the needs and requests of law students, law practitioners, city personnel and other researchers who were in dire need of law books and related materials. When the new City Hall was constructed in January, 1972 still under the stewardship of Mayor Amoranto, the main office transferred to the first floor and it stayed there for ten years. In 1978, Atty. Peralta retired and Mrs. Paciencia J. Buendia took over as the second Superintendent of Libraries.

With the growth in collection of reading materials and personnel, the space became small. Fortunately in 1982, through the representation of the then Superintendent of Libraries Mrs. Paciencia Buendia, Mayor Adelina S. Rodriguez worked for the construction of main library building just at the back of the City Hall. In less than a year, the building was finished to the delight of the reading public and it was inaugurated on August 6, 1983. The QC Main Public Library is the biggest public library maintained by a city government in Metro Manila. It has a conference room and a big reading room which compose the reference, children's and periodical sections. Aside from this, it has its own binding section where book issues of important publications and worn out books are bound and preserved. The Conference Room serves as site of local and national conferences, meetings, book and art exhibits, cultural, educational and religious activities. It is air-conditioned and has a seating capacity of one hundred people. During the term of Mayor Rodriguez, two other branches were added, they are the Barangay Del Monte

and Barangay Masagana branch libraries, while the Roxas branch was completely reconstructed. As of now, the QC Public Library has ten branch libraries operating within the QC area.

Mrs. Relinda A. Feliciano assumed the superintendency upon the retirement of Mrs. Paciencia J. Buendia in 1985.

Since she took over, Mrs. Feliciano and her assistant have intensified the campaign for book donations and as a result, the resources have increased tremendously. Our clientele includes not only students in all levels but the general public as well. They are the retirees, professionals and non-professionals, out-of-school-youths, and children from age three. These clientele come not only from QC, but from the rest of Metro Manila.

The administration of the incumbent Mayor, Brigido R. Simon, Jr. has provided the library with a paper copier which has long been desired and needed by the reading public.

#### SOURCES OF COLLECTION

Aside from the funds allocated by the city government for the purchase of books and other reading materials, the collections come from the National Library, Asia Foundation, Thomas Jefferson Cultural Center, foreign embassies, government and private entities, private individuals, QC post office. As of today, it has a collection of around 50,000 copies of books and other reading materials.

#### MATERIAL RESOURCES

The library has books on almost all subjects, general reference; legal literature, fictions,

best sellers, children's books, maps, digests, journals, gazettes, public documents, government religious & educational publications, all the major newspapers; local and foreign magazines; general information files and many others.


